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LGF ANNUAL REVIEW FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR ENDING 31ST AUGUST 2024

INTRODUCTION:

The prime purpose of this report is to provide Liverpool school governors, academy trustees, and our partners with a succinct overview of our key activities and the progress we have made during the 2023/24 academic year.

Governors and trustees have an important role in the education and support of our children and the LGF was established in 1996 to coordinate and represent the views of Liverpool's Governors and Trustees on the various high-level strategic education committees which operate in the city.

LGF works closely with several key partners, which include the three Liverpool Headteachers' Associations, Liverpool Learning Partnership, Liverpool Local Authority, School Improvement Liverpool, and the National Governance Association.

The range of committees on which LGF members serve is listed in Appendix A, together with the name of the member and the committees on which he/she currently represents the LGF.

OVERVIEW COMMENTS BY MICHAEL MORRIS, LGF CHAIR:

I have much pleasure in welcoming you to this tenth formal LGF Annual Review, which is also my third report as the LGF Chair.

It was another interesting and challenging academic year for the LGF committee with high demands from both schools and governors for our support. Once again we received numerous requests from across Liverpool city schools to sit as independent governors on various panels.

In view of the particular demands to sit as independent panel members for school complaints, we decided to undertake some refresher training. This was delivered by the specialist provider Forrest Governance. It was well received by the committee who felt it ensured they were fully up-to-date with current practice and equipped them to meet their statutory obligations. I am confident we have an experienced and well-trained team to meet school requests in the future.

Another project we have been working hard on due to requests for general information is producing a generic induction booklet for new governors/local academy governors. It will be a comprehensive guide for those new to governance which we aim to have available for launch at our proposed November conference.

With the demands on our services, we were not able to deliver a conference during the reporting year. However, we plan to address this with a conference on **Saturday 16th November, 2024**. Please do make a note of the date and further details will be issued shortly.

On behalf of the LGF, I would like to take the opportunity to offer our congratulations to all those schools and partners involved in the Hearts programme on being awarded the prestigious "Pearson National Teaching Gold Award in the category: Impact through Partnership". (NB: The Hearts programme is a framework that has been developed to support Liverpool schools to become attachment and trauma-responsive informed. The project is led by Hope School in conjunction with Liverpool Virtual School. Initially, 10 schools were engaged in this Hearts project, which has now grown to 32 Liverpool schools, and a further 16 will be joining in September. The LGF Honorary Secretary is Chair of Governors at Hope School).

It would be remiss of me if I did not record my thanks to my fellow hard-working committee colleagues for their commitment and dedication to representing Liverpool governors/trustees over the last academic year. As a result, they have ensured governors/trustees had an input into the important educational decision-making on behalf of Liverpool Schools.

Finally, special thanks to Dave Owens, for taking on the important role of LGF Honorary Treasurer, and Paula Anderson for the prompt and effective secretarial service she provides, coupled with her general support which is greatly appreciated.

FUNDING AND FINANCE:

LGF is funded by subscriptions from the majority of Liverpool schools; primary, special, and secondary at a nominal charge of £25 per school. This is collected on our behalf through the three Headteacher Associations, which is much appreciated. This enables us to play a full and active role in improving educational standards in Liverpool.

As academisation continues to grow, some academy schools are unfortunately no longer contributing or engaging with us. We, therefore, hope that local academy trustees will reappraise the situation, particularly as we continue to receive requests for our support.

To ensure financial control and accountability, we have a "Finance and Operating Manual" which sets out important parameters and is regularly reviewed and updated as required. The accounts are also independently audited.
